Applications will be accepted from those who are interested in residing the available public housing units as follows.

Available Public Housing

Shichizacho medium rise housing	2DK(for more than two occupants)	1 vacancy for each housing	
Nishi-Obukuro medium rise housing (Child rearing support housing)	3DK (for more than three occupants)		

How to apply: Submit your applications by post to the Saitama Housing Provision Corporation from June 1(Thu) to 21(Wed) (Post mark valid).

For further information (eligibility requirements, etc.): Please check the application guidelines. *They will be available at the general reception counter of the city office (main building 1 F), the floor guide desk (2nd building 1F), Housing and Construction Inspection Section (main building 6F), Northern and Southern branch offices of the city office and at each community center. They can also be printed from the city website.



This corner introduces thoughts and experiences of people involved and who support the promotion of multicultural coexistence projects in Koshigaya.

This month, Mr. Masami Kikuchi will share his experiences. He has been engaged in support for foreign nationals for a long time as a volunteer of Japanese classes in Koshigaya.

It has been about five years since I began volunteering to help foreign nationals learn Japanese. During this time, I have worked hard to come up with ways to support their language learning journey. However, I have recently come to realize that helping someone learn Japanese is also an opportunity to relearn "Japanese language" and "Japanese culture", which I had previously taken for granted.

For example, Japanese does not have a future tense. In order to explain this concept to foreign nationals, it is necessary to understand the differences between Japanese and their native languages. Simply saying "In this case, we normally say this" is not enough. It is ideal for Japanese language teachers to understand the attributes of Japanese and the students' native languages before explaining linguistic concepts for mutual understanding and better communication.

A language is a reflection of its culture. Therefore, teaching a language can also be viewed as teaching its corresponding culture. Helping foreign nationals learn Japanese, for instance, can serve as an opportunity for multicultural interaction. This means that we can learn to remove barriers between teachers and students in order to understand each other better, while also becoming aware of cultural taboos that should not be breached. It is essential for Japanese teachers to humbly relearn both Japanese and Japanese culture, establish their own criteria, and make an effort to understand their students' cultures. By doing so, helping foreign nationals learn Japanese can serve as an opportunity for our own personal growth and development.
