



Educational Loan for School Admission

Available to parents/guardians living in Koshigaya with financial difficulty for school admission expenses for their child who will enter high school, college, etc., in April 2025. (Application can be made before the announcement of the entrance exam result) *Certain conditions (on income) must be met.

How much (Limits of Loan): High school: Up to ¥500,000 /College: Up to ¥800,000 *No interest

*Repayment should be made within 5 years through annual or bi-annual installments.

Application: October 1 – October 21, 2024 (1st batch)

January 6 – January 27, 2025 (2nd batch)

Get to know the characteristics of flood disaster in Koshigaya!

Koshigaya is a flat terrain, which is greatly affected by heavy rain. Due to its geographical traits, water cannot be drained easily and it accumulates in the area, causing flooding. Traditionally, Japan's typhoon and rainy season begins in June and ends in October. Stay prepared for disasters.

Key points!

- 1. Confirm when to evacuate and what to do to protect yourself in an emergency situation.
- 2. Make a contingency plan in advance to evacuate safely. Think about life-saving actions.
- 3. Prepare necessary items such as food and a portable toilet.

Hello, everyone!

I'm Daya, from the Philippines and working as a CIR of the Koshigaya City Office. In this column, I would like to introduce a Filipino custom which I learned in my childhood, "Pagmamano".

Every 3rd Monday of September, Japan celebrates 'Respect for the Aged Day'which is locally known as KEIRO NO HI. Normally, families celebrate by visiting their parents and grandparents and have dinner together. Most people bring gifts too.

In the Philippines, I don't remember if we have a special holiday for the celebration, and referring it as a national holiday. But we do have a celebration which starts every October 1st called Elderly Filipino Week, to honor and celebrate our elderly Filipinos. And today, I want to share one Filipino custom of showing respect and honor for elders. We call it *"Pagmamano"*. It's a gesture wherein we bow and get the right hand of the elder and gently strikes it to our forehead. And while doing the gesture, we say "Mano Po" and the elder usually says "Bless you" or "God bless you". It is usually done to our parents, grandparents, and older relatives, and teachers, friends of our parents or anybody whom we know and respect. I learned the gesture of *Pagmamano* when I was little. My parents and elders taught me that it is one of the important values that shows respect, humility and the importance of family bonds. In the Filipino culture we cherish the importance of being loyal to our families and most elderly live with their children or grandchildren to be taken care of. Having our parents or grandparents live with us is one gesture of respecting their value in the family.
